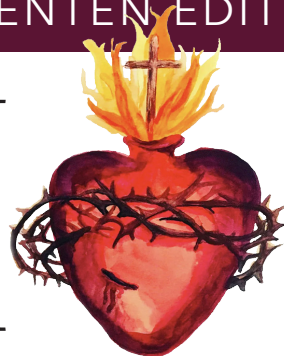

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: A PERSONAL EXPERIENCE

There is nothing like Eucharistic Adoration. Jesus is truly present in the monstrance and like receiving Jesus in the Communion, you know that God is there and with you.

I often used to stop by the Tabernacle in the chapel after going to the church office to say a quick prayer and ask for God's guidance. When churches were closed in 2020, I missed my short visits to say "hi" to Jesus. When St. Pius resumed Eucharistic Adoration on First Fridays, I resolved to make it part of my monthly routine. I was not sure what I would do. I read, prayerfully, the daily Mass readings. I also bring prayers to recite as well. I have prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet. I always try to give lots of time to pause between my prayer to listen what God may be saying to me and bask in His great love for me.

Some First Friday Eucharistic Adorations do feel more fruitful, when I feel more at peace afterwards. And there are other times when I am distracted. I feel that my prayers are hijacked by to-do lists. However, I firmly believe that those more difficult times or prayer are never a waste of time and I trust that the Lord is drawing me into a closer relationship with Him for His own reason, in His own way.

Eucharistic Adoration is a special opportunity to sit or kneel closely and to see Jesus. Seeing Him bolsters my belief in the Real Presence. I feel and know that God is God - and I am not - during Eucharistic Adoration. It is truly a special time. Based on my experience, I would encourage everyone to make time for Adoration at least once. You never know ... you may just need to slow down in order to hear God's gentle whisper.

LENTEN BOOK DRIVE: EXTEND YOUR COMPASSION TO THOSE IN NEED!

As we embark on the season of Lent, let us reflect on the words from Matthew 25:36: "I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me." While it may not be feasible for all of us to physically visit those in prison, Hebrews 13:3 encourages us to "Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are mistreated, since you also are in the body."

This Lenten season, the Central North Carolina Order of Malta Prison Ministry is teaming with Sentences Book Donations to provide a tangible way for us to remember and support those who are in need. We are excited to announce the initiation of our Lenten Book Drive, beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing throughout the season of Lent and concluding on Easter.

How can you participate? During Lent, look for our collection boxes at the back of the church. Before or after Mass, drop off your gently used or new books in one of these designated boxes. That simple! Additionally, during one Saturday during Lent, we will sponsor a drive through drop-off in front of the Simmons Center. Load your books into your car and we'll unload them curbside! Look for more details to come on this, including opportunities for 7th and 8th graders to volunteer for some meaningful services hours.

What are appropriate books? If you're wondering what kinds of books to donate, the general rule is that if it's popular outside of prison, it's popular inside. Those serving time appreciate reading the same popular non-fiction and genre fiction we do, including thrillers, mysteries, fantasy, sci-fi, etc. Prisons allow reading material in any mainstream category you would find at a book store. A few additional categories that are commonly requested inside the prison system are Westerns, Spanish-language reading, "how to" books that teach trade skills, and books on starting your own business. Young Adult reading is welcome and will find a good home at a youth facility. Please do not donate magazines, comics, or spiral-bound books as most prisons will not accept these.

Where are the books going? Books collected during this time will be donated to various locations in most need of books. In fact, one area is right here in town, the Guilford County Jail. Your donation can have a direct impact on our community right here in the Triad. Another location is the Colbert Lauderdale Attention Home in Florence, AL, a facility for at risk youth boys and girls ages 10-18. In late 2022, their home experienced a devastating fire that destroyed their entire book collection. We aim to rebuild their library and support other locations in need.

What happens next? At the conclusion of the drive, all books will be sorted by appropriateness of content and delivered to one of these facilities. Unique donations may be paired with other facilities nationwide based on need.

Let's heed the call of Matthew 25:39: "And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?" This Lenten season provides a wonderful opportunity for us to keep those in need in our hearts and prayers. Thank you for your compassion and generosity!

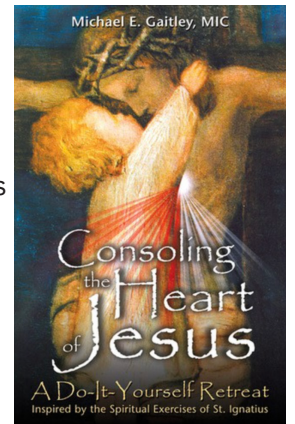

BOY SCOUTS TRAVELED TO PHILMONT SCOUT RANCH

Nine Boy Scouts and five Advisors from Troop 244 traveled to Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, New Mexico to spend two weeks in the backcountry. The group flew into Denver and visited some attractions and made their way to New Mexico. They visited the Wings Over the Rockies Air & Space Museum, Pike's Peak (by cog train), and Cave of the Winds. After one night at base camp at Philmont, they spent ten days and nights on the trail, hiking over 65 miles! During the trek they participated in events such as shotgun shooting, tomahawk throwing, spar pole climbing, railroading, and climbing Baldy Mountain (elevation 12,441 ft.). The scouts began and ended their trip with a full Catholic Mass held at base camp and worked three hours on a conservation project on the trail.
