


A MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

At the beginning of the school year we read the familiar parable of "The Three Stewards." During their master's absence, he gave each of them charge of a specific amount of coins according to their ability. When the master returned, they reported to him what they had done with that which had been

entrusted to them. Two of them make a good return on the investment and so receive the praise and trust of their master and are then entrusted with more. The third steward confesses that he knew his master to be hard and demanding, so out of fear he just buried the amount put in his care. The master expresses his harsh disappointment with him and it does not go well at all for that third steward.

I always found the outcome of the parable rather startling, until I understood it in terms of faith. The parable basically says: "To those who have much, more will be given them. And to those who have little, the little they have will be taken away from them." Each of us has been given the gift of faith and we have been entrusted with an amount that corresponds to our ability. If, during this period when we await the return of our Master, we use that gift and invest that gift in opportunities to grow in knowledge, build community, and serve the mission, we

might be astonished at the return on investment.

The amazing compounding interest on kindness is something to behold in this world and certainly in the next. But, there is that troubling part of the parable that reminds us that if we are to risk adversity and act out fear, not even seeking safe and secure opportunities, the little we have will could be taken away from us. So I am no longer surprised when someone who is nominally Catholic flounders or fails under the many pressures of a crisis or the various trials of life. The naive faith that was little nurtured after Confirmation will evaporate in the drought of some spiritual desert or firestorm of life that comes our way.


While the parable has a harsh tone, it's one we need to hear as we all settle in to our routine and discipline for the days ahead. I think a modern paraphrase of the parable would be that we, as stewards of the gift of faith, had better "Use it or Lose it!" This is not the time to be risk adverse, operating out

of fear of failure or embarrassment. Instead, as a good servant, consider joining our fall community commitment to trust in the Economy of Grace and witness what the Lord can do. Truly, we have been given much, and I believe there is even more in store for God's Faithful Ones.

In this issue of *Echoes*, you'll find just a few of the many opportunities to use your faith and to exercise your faith - that it may not only increase in you, but expand and overflow to others.



FINANCIAL REPORT TO PARISHIONERS

Dear St. Pius X Parishioners:

I'm happy to provide for your review a consolidated statement of activities for the period beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023.

For the period, offertory income was \$1,955,252 - which was slightly below budget. Total operating revenue of \$2,302,224 exceeded total operating expenses of \$2,038,723, resulting in net operating activity for the period of \$263,501. A favorable result.

Through the generosity of our parishioners we were able to accomplish a great deal over the past fiscal year. In addition to our vibrant ministries we were able embrace the following projects for our campus.

- Our parking lot repaving project was completed July 2022 enhancing the functionality and beauty of our St. Pius X facility.
- We were able to install Bollards at the entrance of the DeJoy Primary Education (continued on next page ...)

- Center improving the safety of our property.
- Construction started on the pavilion located on the school grounds. The pavilion will be a magnificent addition to St. Pius X offering a place to gather for events and a place supporting student education.
- Our playground received an incredible addition of new equipment providing our school children a wonderful opportunity to enjoy playing together.
- New attractive containment dumpster walls replaced old containment walls that were in disrepair.

We look forward to the 2023-2024 fiscal year projects that will continue to provide an opportunity to Know, Love and Serve our Lord, and each other. The financial health of St. Pius X is strong. As good stewards we continue to manage expenses closely and we carefully consider the initiatives we pursue.

None of this could be accomplished without your past, and continued, financial support – Thank You! I also want to thank in a special way our Parish Finance Council for their leadership in support of our mission. 


